

Nancy loves using big fancy words such as "iridescent", "ecstatic", and "extraordinary" and anything in French. Within seconds,, I found myself creating connections between education under COVID-19 and Nancy's opinion of her family. Mainstream media is bombarding parents and school districts alike with:


- Online engagement



At Poolville, you and your children MATTER!


You are our FAMILY!

This picture to the right is one of the most famous countdown clocks on the planet. It's NASA's historic countdown clock, which the space agency retired and replaced four years ago. Two years ago it was restarted for a new audience of launch and tour spectators.

So.....what's required to register?

Will you have a new student, a kindergarten student, or a pre-k student at Poolville Elementary School this year? If you answered "Yes", we encourage parents to pre-register their child or children online at:

Once you have successfully completed this process, please visit us any time Monday through Thursday (July 27th through July 30th) from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm to complete the final components of the registration process. School tours will be available during these times. Additionally, we will offer evening registration hours on Thursday, July 30th from 5:00 pm through 7:00 pm.

To facilitate the process, please bring the following items:

- A state issued ID card
- Proof of residence within Poolville ISD (contract on the house, lease agreement, actual title to the house, current Poolville ISD tax statement, or current utility bill indicating the address and the adult's name.)
- For Kindergarten, the child (or children) must be age 5 or older by or on September 1, 2020.
- For Pre-Kindergarten, the child (or children) must be age 4 or older by or on September 1, 2020.
- For the Pre-Kindergarten 3 Program, the child (or children) must be age 3 or older by or on September 1, 2020. \*Please contact the front office to determine if you are eligible for this program.
- Child's official birth certificate
- Child's immunization record, and
- Child's social security card (Preferred but will not prevent enrollment)


Given school safety and COVID constraints, parent/teacher conferencing will not transpire at this time. Those opportunities will be made available later in the semester.
