

With apologies to Gertrude Crampton, I contend that the true moral of the story is that occasionally we need to leave the tracks, color outside the lines, do something that makes our palms sweaty. Put



#### Making Learning Fun At Home!

Are you tired of hearing groans when you announce it's time for summer learning? These active math games are just what you need! Kids won't even realize they're learning important concepts along the way. Many of these math games can be customized to teach a variety of skills, so pick a few to try. Your Monarch will beg for more math and learning time!

- Challenge your Monarch to a flashcard race. To begin, tape a series of flashcards to
  the floor and challenge your child to see who can correctly make their way from start to
  finish the fastest. They can call out the answers or write them down, but they have to get it
  right before they move on. Kids can race side by side, or work independently to beat their
  own best time.
- Head out on a plot graph scavenger hunt. Create a map of your house, community
  playground, or backyard area using graph paper (or even better have your kid help you do
  it). Then choose plot points for them to visit to find notes or small prizes. They'll feel like
  real treasure hunters!
- Create a life-size number line. Number lines are wonderful for all sorts of math games
  and activities. Make one big enough for your kid to stand and jump around on using
  sidewalk chalk (or painter's tape indoors). You'll use it over and over again.
- Do a number dance. Kids who love "Dance Dance Revolution" will get into this one.
   Make a number mat for each child like the ones shown. Flash an equation with an answer between 10 and 99 on the screen. Kids figure out the answer and jump to put their left foot on the correct tens place, right foot on the ones. They'll be dancing and spinning as they learn!
- Hunt for shapes in the world around you. So simple and so fun! Give each of your
  children a sheet with shapes to find as you walk around the house or community. Each time
  they find the shape, have them trace it on their worksheet and then make a mark to keep
  track of how many times they've seen it.
- Design an outdoor board game. Draw a winding path and fill the spaces with math
  equations. Your children can roll the dice and move from space to space (have them jump,
  skip, or twirl to mix things up). If they get the answer right, they move to the new space. If
  not, their turn is over. Customizable math games like this can be used at any skill level.



Turn UNO into an action math game. Grab your UNO deck and get ready to move!
 Assign each color a movement (hop, touch toes, etc.). As your children draw the cards, everyone in the household completes the movement the correct number of times. Skip and Reverse work as usual, but anyone who gets Draw Two has to draw two more cards, and complete the actions on their own while everyone in the house cheers them on.


- They enrich a child's language development on multiple levels.
