"She Works Hard for the Money" is a song by American singer Donna Summer from her 1983 eleventh studio album of the same name. The song was written by Michael Omartian and Summer, and produced by the former. It was released as the lead single in 1983 from the album by Mercury Records.

It became a hit for Summer and is one of her signature songs, reaching number one for a three-week stay atop the Billboard R&B singles chart (her first since 1979), number three on the Billboard Hot 100, and number three on the Dance Club Play chart. The single ended up as Billboard's fifteenth-best performing song of 1983.

I offer this now because a friend recently asked me, "Jason, why do you keep your school's calendar so busy?"


We Recognized a Super Student of the Week...

Poolville Elementary School is proud to report that it is again teaming up with PTO to host the 1st annual "Pumpkins, Paint & PTO" event.





We Continued Our Daily Instructional Focus...

Can you identify the object pictured below?

If you answered, "A Magic 8-Ball" please give yourself a hand.

The Magic 8-Ball is a plastic sphere, made to look like an eight-ball, that is used for fortune-telling or seeking advice. It was invented in 1946 by Albert C. Carter and Abe Bookman and is currently manufactured by Mattel.

It was Dr. Lucien Cohen, a psychology professor at the University of Cincinnati, who partnered with the creators of the Magic 8 Ball and decided upon 20 possible responses:

- 10 positive
- 5 negative, and
- 5 indifferent.







So how does this pertain to educational excellence at PES? That's easy! We are about to collectively begin our 8th-week of the instructional year. Let's not let soothsayers, examiners of crystal balls, the Magic 8-Ball, or tarot card readers drive our instructional focus and practices.

Instead, let's turn to the five most proven instructional strategies for primary-age learners. These strategies are:

- Differentiated instruction through the use of learning stations
- Cooperative learning through the use of the jigsaw method
- Inquiry-based instruction supported by planned, targeted questions and questioning stems
- Graphic organizers like thinking maps and Frayer Models, and
- Multi learning modality lessons utilizing the Cone of Learning.
